Pollinators are responsible for one in every three bites of food. By supporting their health, Nebraska Extension helps ensure the resilience of our food systems and wellbeing of our communities.

Dena Stevenson, Engagement and Outreach Manager at Kimmel Orchard, emphasizes the impact of Nebraska Extension programs on pollinator health. The orchard, which hosts UNL Bee Lab research and teaching bee hives, recently certified a new pollinator garden through the Nebraska Pollinator Habitat Certification program. With thousands of visitors each year, these initiatives ripple outward as visitors gain tools to promote pollinator health in their communities. These efforts not only help pollinators thrive, but also support the orchard's 90 acres of food production, drive economic growth, and enhance science education.

"We know pollinators are in decline due, in large part, to fewer spaces to forage and nest. Native habitat education is about providing food and spaces for pollinators and people alike.

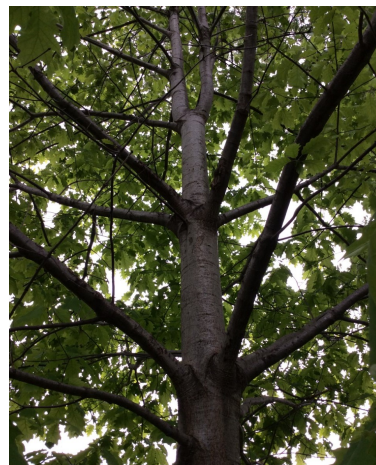
